INTRODUCTION

Healthcare is one of the pioneering areas in social work intervention. The contribution of social work to medical disciplines assists and allows for bio-psycho-social approaches to health and illness. In-depth study of issues such as the determinants of health, lifestyles and inequalities in health, as well as the bases of social work in the public health system and attention to situations of vulnerability caused by the loss of the former, will complement knowledge previously acquired in other healthcare-related subjects.
